Lockett became Cavalry post; was the last Cavalry post. n nCavalry / Sp Am War: was in dead tent in Cuba (1898-1902) with YellowFever. Told him he looked too good and sent him away to recover. n nCavalry: Had two Navajo trackers. Chased Geronimo. n nCavalry: Would go to West Point to get recruits at graduation. n nHad a foot locker when kids were young. When he would leave, they would rush in to see what they could find in locker, i.e. candy, xmas gifts. n nCollected butterflies. n nWas custodian of L.A. Armory. n nCavalry: was in Fort Smith AR, Fort Grant AZ, Marfa TX, Fort Ogilthorpe GA, Monterey CA, Glendale CA.
