Priscilla Jane Hitchcock was born on March 27, 1927, the daughter of C. W. and Berle Comfort Hitchcock, at Creston, Iowa. She received her education in Creston, graduating from Creston High School in 1944. Following her graduation, she taught grade school in Creston. She was united in marriage to John Kastler of Woolstock on March 27, 1948 at Story City. The couple made their home near Woolstock, prior to moving to Osceola in 1963. She returned to school in 1971, attending Southwest Community College where she received her LPN degree in Nursing. She was employed in the pediatrics ward of Broadlawns Medical Center in Des Moines until 1975. She then began working at the Osceola Leisure Manor Nursing Home until her retirement in 1985. John Kastler died on November 5, 1990.

Priscilla Jane Kastler died at her home in Osceola on April 25, 1995 at the age of 68 years and 28 days.

Survivors include her sons, Monte Kastler, Osceola and John Kastler of Cherokee; daughters, Connie Kastler of Duncombe, Cyndi Kastler and Jane Kastler, both of Osceola; and four grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband and one brother, Bill Hitchcock.

Mrs. Henry Kastler died at the home of her son, John Kastler, in Woolstock township, early last Friday morning. She has been a resident of Woolstock township for 58 years, and until the time of her fatal illness, made her home on her own farm. She came to Woolstock township with her husband and settled on the old Kastler homestead, and for 58 years lived on the same farm. At that time there were but two houses between their own and Webster City. Mrs. Kastler was in every sense a pioneer. She was born in France and came to America when she was 17 years of age. Crossing the ocean and learning a new language and adopting new customs, being her first bit of pioneering. The following, very fitting obituary was read at the funeral services which were held at the French church, which is located on the Kastler homestead.
